## **MATCHES ON MELVILLE RANGE**

*Friday 31 January 13.30-16.00 (Advancing courses only);*

*Sunday 2 February 08.30-12.30*

**COURSE OF FIRE: ADVANCING HUMBUG**

One sighting series, then two series to count (GRCF) or one series to count (MLP), fired at a pair of DP1 targets as they advance from 25 metres. In each series, competitors fire six shots (three at each target). Available matches:

**Crosse**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Muzzle Loading Pistol

*Shooting Conditions:* To be shot with one hand unsupported

**Wharncliffe**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Gallery Rifle Centre Fire (GRCF using optics will be scored outward-gauging, those using iron sights inward-gauging)

*Shooting Conditions:* Freestanding, use of sling not permitted

**COURSE OF FIRE: CHARGING DOMINO**

One sighting series, then two series to count, fired at a single GR5 target as it advances from 25 metres. In each series, GRSB competitors fire ten shots (two at each aiming mark on the GR5). Available matches:

**Luard**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Gallery Rifle Small Bore

*Shooting Conditions:* Freestanding, use of sling not permitted

### COURSE OF FIRE: PRECISION & DUEL

Up to five sighting shots in five minutes followed by two stages to count at 50 metres: fifteen shots precision in ten minutes, and fifteen shots duelling. To be shot on the PL7 target throughout. Available matches:

#### **Albert Edward**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Gallery Rifle Centre Fire (GRCF using optics will be scored outward-gauging, those using iron sights inward-gauging)

*Shooting Conditions:* Freestanding, use of sling not permitted

#### **Alexandra**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Gallery Rifle Small Bore

*Shooting Conditions:* Freestanding, use of sling not permitted

### COURSE OF FIRE: STANDARD

Up to five sighting shots in 150 seconds, followed by thirty shots to count on the PL7 target at 50 metres: two series each of five shots in 150 seconds, two series each of five shots in 20 seconds, and two series each of five shots in 10 seconds. Available matches:

#### **A.G.**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Gallery Rifle Small Bore

*Shooting Conditions:* Freestanding, use of sling not permitted

#### **Guy**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Air Pistol

*Shooting Conditions:* To be shot with one hand unsupported

#### **Gabbett-Fairfax**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Long Barrelled Pistol

*Shooting Conditions:* May be shot one or two handed

### COURSE OF FIRE: BOBBING HUN

Four series of five shots to count, without previous sighters, on the 1914 figure target at 50 metres. In the first two series, one shot is fired at the left-hand target on each of five 3 second exposures, and in the last two series, one shot is fired at the right hand target on each of five 2 second exposures. In all series the target faces away for 7 seconds between exposures. Available match:

#### **Roberts**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Gallery Rifle Small Bore

*Shooting Conditions:* Freestanding, use of sling not permitted

## **MATCHES ON SHORT SIBERIA**

*Saturday 1 February, 08.30-12.30; 13.30-16.00*

### COURSE OF FIRE: TEN ROUNDS

Two sighters, individually marked, followed by a series of ten shots to count, in the position prescribed for the individual match, in ten minutes. Available matches:

#### **Fulton**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Any rifle with any sights

*Shooting Conditions:* To be shot prone; use of sling, bipod or rest permitted

#### **Harrison**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Any iron-sighted centrefire carbine of a type in use before 1945, with an overall length under 42½"

*Shooting Conditions:* To be shot standing; use of sling not permitted.

#### **Newitt**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Any .22LR rifle with any sights

*Shooting Conditions:* To be shot standing; use of sling not permitted

#### **Ross**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Any centrefire rifle of a type in use before 1945, with period iron sights and accessories

*Shooting Conditions:* To be shot standing; use of period sling permitted. Modern supportive shooting jackets, if worn, must be unfastened and straps slack

#### **Wallingford**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Any centrefire rifle of a type in use before 1945, with period iron sights and accessories

*Shooting Conditions:* To be shot prone. Use of period sling permitted, otherwise unsupported. Modern supportive shooting jackets, if worn, must be unfastened and straps slack

#### COURSE OF FIRE: THREE AND FOUR POSITIONAL

Two sighters, individually marked, followed by a series of five shots to count in five minutes, in each of the positions prescribed for the individual match.

Available matches:

##### **Cooper**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Any rifle with iron sights

*Shooting Conditions:* To be shot in the three positions: prone, kneeling, standing.

Use of sling and kneeling roll permitted, otherwise unsupported

##### **Selous**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Any centrefire rifle with any sights

*Shooting Conditions:* To be shot in the four positions: prone, sitting, kneeling, and standing. Use of sling, bipod or rest permitted in prone position, and kneeling roll and sling in remaining positions

#### COURSE OF FIRE: SNIPER

Two sighters, individually marked, on a static Figure 14 target, followed by one scoring series of ten 3 second exposures of a moving Figure 14; one shot to be fired on each exposure. Away periods between exposures will vary between 5 and 10 seconds. Available match:

##### **Hesketh-Prichard**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Any rifle with any sights

*Shooting Conditions:* Any safe position. Use of sling, bipod or rest permitted

#### COURSE OF FIRE: MARTIN'S MINUTE

Two sighting shots, individually marked, then series of fifteen rounds in one minute, prone. The scoring series commences with the rifle charged with a maximum of five cartridges, all other ammunition carried on the person; the rifle may be reloaded with individual rounds or with clips or magazines containing no more than five rounds each. Available match:

##### **Snoxall**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Any full-power centrefire rifle with any sights

*Shooting Conditions:* Use of sling, bipod or other support not permitted

#### COURSE OF FIRE: SNAPS

Two sighting shots, individually marked, then series of ten scoring shots, standing, one shot to be fired on each 4 second exposure of a Fig.11/DP1 target, returning to a 45° start position between exposures. Away period between exposures will vary between 5 and 10 seconds. Available match:

##### **Marks**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Any British service rifle with issue equipment.

#### COURSE OF FIRE: 1903 RAPID

Two sighting shots, individually marked, then series of seven scoring shots, standing, on a Fig.11/DP1 target in 50 seconds, commencing from a 45° start position. Available match:

##### **Cannon**

*Weapon Entry Category:* Any centrefire rifle of a type in use before 1945, with period iron sights and accessories.

*Shooting Conditions:* Use of period sling permitted, otherwise unsupported.

Modern supportive shooting jackets, if worn, must be unfastened and straps slack
